HOMEPORTS FOR USS HENRY W. TUCKER

Launch --	Orange Texas	1945	Once underway, TUCKER never returned to Orange Texas.
Homeport --	Portland Maine	1945	Assigned from June 1945 until September 1945.
Homeport --	San Diego California	1945	Homeport not changed for seven years, but there were three lengthy Overhaul periods, Two at Mare Island Naval Shipyard and one at Long Beach, plus four trips to the Far East, and three additional tours to Korea.
Homeport --	Long Beach California	1952	Homeport switched to Long Beach for another 7 years. There were six more tours to the Far East.
Homeport --	Yokosuka Japan	1960	First foreign homeport, for 31 months, until departure from Yokosuka in November 1962.
FRAM --	Boston Massachusetts	1963	This major FRAM re-build lasted just over a year until January 1964.
Homeport --	Long Beach California	1964	This was a temporary homeport to train and muster together the remainder of DESDIV 32.
Homeport --	Yokosuka Japan	1964	This foreign homeport was from June 1964 until departure from Yokosuka in July 1966.
Homeport --	Long Beach California	1967	Extensive yard period, six months of refresher training, and another tour to the Far East. This lasted until December 1967.
Homeport --	Yokosuka Japan	1968	From July 1968 through all of July 1970, TUCKER was in Far East waters, a total of 25 months.
Homeport --	San Diego California	1970	This time, from San Diego, TUCKER made 2 deployments to the Far East. They included a six month and a seven month tour.
Decommissioned --		1973	Transferred to Brazil in December.

Homeport --	Rio de Janeiro Brazil	1974	Sold to Brazil, TUCKER had Become Marcilio Dias (D 25) . Marcilio Dias was part of the Brazilian Navy for 20 years.
Final Disposition --		1994	Used for target practice, and sunk in the South Atlantic Ocean.

1964 - - - Yokosuka -	3 December until mid January .

5 December 1957 - - - From Pearl Harbor to Pago Pago, Good Will tour - - - - - Longitude = 165° 30' E
Returned from Manus Island across the equator to Subic Bay – December 29, 1957

5 June 1965 - - - - - From gun line off Vietnam to Singapore - - - - - Longitude = 105° 10' E
Returned across the equator to Subic Bay – 12 June 1965

8 August 1969 - - - - - From gun line off Vietnam to Singapore - - - - - Longitude = 105° 00' E
Returned across the equator back to the Vietnam gun line – 13 August 1969

28 November 1971 - - - From Satahip Thailand to Singapore - - - - - Longitude = 105° 31' E
Returned to Subic Bay on 30 November in preparation for the voyage back to CONUS

10 January 1973 - - - - - From Subic Bay to Manus Island - - - - - Longitude = 140° 20' E
Returned across equator 9 February 1973 from Papeete, Tahiti north toward Pearl Harbor, HI

TRAVERSING THE PANAMA CANAL

November 1945 (Westward) - - - From Casco Bay ME (DESRON) 10 to San Diego CA (DESRON 5)

December 1962 (Eastward) - - - From Long Beach CA to Charlestown MA for FRAM rebuild

January 1964 (Westward) - - - - From Charlestown MA back to San Diego
