One of the reunion events was to be a ride on one of the Duck Boats. In light of the horrific accident last month in which several people were killed, we have removed the Duck Boat ride from that day's tour. We will, however, still have the lunch and show on the Branson Belle. Donald Shepherd is looking into other possibilities. For now, we are keeping the original price. If for some reason, there is no replacement event, refunds will be made at the reunion.

If you haven't made your hotel reservations yet, please do so now. We need an accurate count of attendees and the hotel needs to have an accurate count as well. If you need to cancel at a later date, you can always do so.

We are receiving MANY postal returns of newsletters, most with no forwarding addresses. I do a quick lookup on White Pages (addresses) and Legacy (obituaries). Most of the additions to the memorial list in this newsletter are found on Legacy after their newsletters have been returned, but others we are unable to find. This is time consuming as Bill has to make phone calls if we can find a number listing, so we can verify the new address is for the person we are looking for. It is also costly in extra postage and envelopes. The paragraph below is in every newsletter, but we are still getting 20+ returns with each newsletter. Beginning with this newsletter, I will check Legacy for obituaries, but will no longer spend time looking for new addresses and phone numbers, and you will no longer receive newsletters. If you receive the newsletter by email and your mailing address and/or phone number have changed, please reply to the email and give us your new information.

!!!! IMPORTANT !!!!

If your address, phone number or email address changes, please let us know as soon as possible. We send about 500 newsletters by USPS and over 800 by email. After each newsletter goes out, the post office returns many. Some have new addresses and we incur additional postage to resend them. Some have no forwarding addresses and we have to remove them from future mailings. We also receive many email returns because people's email addresses aren't valid. This means we have to add them to the USPS mailing, incurring additional postage. Sadly, some of those have never informed us of mailing address changes, so they are returned as well. If we don't have a valid address or email address for you, you will no longer receive newsletters.

Please read the following. It contains very important information for veterans and their families!

At the business meeting at the last reunion, Bill brought up the fact that all shipmates (and their family members) should know where their DD-214 (discharge paper) form and other paperwork relating to their military service is located in the event of their veteran's passing. He told about a man who called him at the VFW about his father's recent death. His father had always told him everything he would need was in a box on the mantel. When he opened the box, there was nothing relating to his father's service. Below is listed what you need to have on hand and what you need to do in the event of your veteran relative's passing.

What to do when your Veteran family member passes away.

Contact the Funeral Director of your choice to arrange for services and interment. If the burial is at a military Cemetery, request a Military Funeral and Honor Guard from the National Cemetery or local VFW, DAV, VVA or American Legion group. You may also contact the military recruiter in your area and they may be able to assist you in locating people to assist. Bring to the Funeral Director a copy of the Veteran's discharge, separation notice or DD-214, VA Claim Number, if known, and Veteran's Social Security Number. If the Veteran was a member of any military group or unit association they will also assist you at this time. Contact your church to arrange for the services if you desire.

The Funeral Director will apply for any burial entitlements from the Department of Veterans Affairs toward burial expenses and also the allowance from Social Security for burial. The Funeral Director will also apply for the flag to drape the casket. If the Veteran is a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Post Commander should be contacted for the Ritual Service, firing squad, if any and casket bearers if needed. If the Veteran had G.I. Insurance contact the County Veterans Service Officer for assistance in completing the forms. If it is commercial insurance contact an agent of the company that insured the Veteran. The spouse should contact the Social Security Office to file for benefits that may be available for him/herself and for the children.

The Social Security Administration has a toll-free number that operates from 7AM to 7PM - Monday to Friday: 1-800-772-1213.

The County Veterans Service Officer can assist or you can call the Veterans Administration at: 1-800-827-1000. They will assist the spouse and children in obtaining any benefits to which they may be entitled to such as, survivors death benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs and headstone if burial is in a private cemetery. Bring to the County Veterans Service Officer the following information when applying for benefits:

1. Certified copy of the deceased Veterans service record (discharge). DD-214
2. The Department of Veterans Affairs Claim Number if there is one.
3. Social Security numbers of the deceased Veteran, spouse and dependent children.
4. G.I. Insurance policies, if any.
5. Certified copies of marriage license, birth certificates of children and, if any, prior marriages existed, the information regarding when, where, and how dissolved (death or divorce).
6. Certified copy of death certificate of Veteran.

No one wants to think about death, but it is very important to be prepared.
